


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Introduction

In 2018, the Will County Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) Collaborative convened to conduct the fourth iteration of the MAPP process. MAPP is a community driven, strategic planning framework that assists communities in developing and implementing efforts around the prioritization of public health issues and the identification of resources to address them as defined by the 10 Essential Public Health Services. The MAPP process includes four assessments, as shown in the graphic below.



One of the four assessments is the Forces of Change Assessment (FOCA). The Forces of Change Assessment (FOCA) aims to identify all the forces and associated opportunities and threats that can affect, either now or in the future, the local public health system. Forces may be social, economic, political, technological, environmental, scientific, legal and/or ethical in nature.

Forces can be trends, factors or events.

- Trends are patterns over time, such as migration in and out of a community or a growing disillusionment with government.
- Factors are discrete elements, such as a community's large ethnic population, an urban setting, or the jurisdiction's proximity to a major waterway.
- Events are one-time occurrences, such as a hospital closure, a natural disaster, or the passage of new legislation.

During the FOCA, participants answer the following questions:

- What is occurring or might occur that affects the health of our community or the local public health system?
- What specific threats or opportunities are generated by these occurrences?

Assessment Methodology

On March 3, 2019, the Will County MAPP Collaborative distributed the Forces of Change Assessment online. This survey was distributed to members of the MAPP Executive Committee, MAPP Action Teams, Will County Board of Health, Will County Board, AMITA Health Saint Joseph Medical Center Community Leadership Board, the Silver Cross Community Health Commission, and community members.

An email was sent and invited participation in the survey through Survey Monkey to identify the forces of change affecting Will County's local public health system and the community. The survey was divided into three sections and contained open-ended questions, with guided prompts, to identify, rank, and describe threats and opportunities for eight categories of forces. An additional health equity question was included asking if any forces identified will impact equal opportunity for health and access to care. While an answer was not required for every question, diverse community input was encouraged. A definition of each force was provided by clicking a hyperlink that was directed to the Merriam-Webster online dictionary. The deadline to complete this survey was March 22, 2019, however, this was extended to April 1, 2019 to obtain additional responses. Survey results were analyzed by the FOCA Subcommittee and used to gather the top identified forces. This survey was open to anyone who lived or worked in Will County. Those who selected the answer option "I do not live or work in Will County" in Question 1 was directed to the end of the survey.

Following analysis of the survey results by assessment subcommittee members, forces were combined into cross-cutting themes and listed alphabetically. A draft Forces of Change Assessment was presented to the MAPP Executive Committee for review and approval on May 15, 2019.

Forces of Change Assessment (FOCA) Executive Summary

The Forces of Change Assessment (FOCA) elicited broad community input to identify forces of change impacting the local public health system in Will County. Participants reported on current trends, events, and factors that may have implications on the local public health system and quality of life for Will County residents. FOCA participants also addressed threats and opportunities posed by each of the major forces.

An analysis of the forces reported by MAPP Partners and community members throughout the FOCA process produced ten cross-cutting issues, listed below.

- Access to transportation
- Access/affordability of healthy foods
- Access/affordability of housing
- Air and water quality
- Behavioral health/substance abuse
- Equitable and quality health care
- Funding for social service agencies
- Political climate
- Unemployment/underemployment
- Use and influence of technology/social media

When asked to rank the top three forces with the most impact, survey participants ranked (1) Economic Forces, (2) Political Forces, and (3) Social Forces as key issues in Will County.

Regarding these issues, community members identified several opportunities to create positive change in Will County. In general, the following themes of opportunities were identified for each force:

- Increase advocacy
- Increase partnership/coordination
- Increase education
- Increase jobs/employment opportunities

Below are notable opportunities associated with each of the ten cross-cutting issues.

The issues and opportunities mentioned above will inform future strategic planning in Will County to improve the health and overall quality of life of Will County residents. The FOCA and other MAPP assessments are key in identifying and prioritizing health issues in Will County.

Forces of Change Assessment (FOCA) Results

The FOCA survey was developed, tested, and released to MAPP members and community partners via email on March 3, 2019. In this survey, community members (who live and/or work in Will County) were asked to identify forces of change impacting the Will County public health system and community, using eight categories of forces.

We received 89 responses to the survey with 57 complete responses, surpassing our goal of 50 surveys. The survey was distributed to roughly 369 participants. Due to email duplications in listservs and that this survey was open to all who work and live in Will County, the total number of surveys distributed is a best estimate. The response rate for this survey based on the number of surveys distributed is estimated at about 24%. Below are the survey questions and results.


Due to the anonymity of this survey, the participants’ names and agencies have not been collected, however, the following groups were contacted through email to complete the FOCA survey.

- MAPP Action Team members (n=265)
- Will County Board of Health (n=11)
- Will County Board Members (n=26)
- AMITA Health Saint Joseph Medical Center Community Leadership Board (n=16)
- Silver Cross Community Health Commission (n=18)

Results

SECTION I: IDENTIFY ALL FORCES OF CHANGE IN WILL COUNTY, IL

The first question of the survey asked participants to identify if they live and/or work in Will County. Although the responses were fairly even, the majority of participants (38%) work in Will County and live outside of the county.




The next question asked to list all forces of change that affect the local public health system or community locally, nationally and globally. The following table contains the forces of change that were identified for each of the specific survey categories.

Respondents were asked to rank the top three forces that have the most impact on the health of the community in Will County. The top three forces with the most impact as identified by survey respondents are (1) Economic Forces, (2) Political Forces, and (3) Social Forces.




Economic forces were named by 52% of respondents as the force with the most impact on the health of the Will County community.

The top threats identified by those who chose economic forces as the #1 priority are as follows:

- Financial insecurity and stress on families
- Low job opportunities for skilled labor
- Income inequality
- Insufficient funds for medical and behavioral health care
- Underemployment and low wages

The top opportunities identified by those who chose economic forces as the #1 priority are as follows:

- Increase opportunities for employment
- Increase partnerships to address access to services and resources
- Education and awareness campaigns




Economic forces had the most responses (26%) as the force with the second most impact on the health of the Will County community. However, since economic forces were identified as the top force impacting health, the next identified force with the most responses (23%), Political Forces, was analyzed.

The top threats identified by those who chose political forces as the #2 priority are as follows:

- Corruption
- Lack of accountability
- Limited state funding
- No bipartisanship/ increased polarization
- Stress due to political climate

The top opportunities identified by those who chose political forces as the #2 priority are as follows:

- Increase advocacy
- Improve bipartisanship



Social forces had the most responses (20%) as the force with the third most impact on the health of the Will County community.

The top threats identified by those who chose social forces as the #3 priority are as follows:

- Anti-vaccination movement
- Gun violence
- Isolated senior population
- Lack of access to primary and behavioral health services
- Mental health stigma
- Poor diet and exercise

The top opportunities identified by those who chose social forces as the #3 priority are as follows:

- Advocate for more state funding
- Improve community perception of behavioral health
- Increase services to targeted populations

Of the top three forces ranked by survey participants, common themes were identified when asked to list threats and opportunities to be addressed.

Top themes for identified threats

- Lack of access to health/services
- Lack of funding
- Lack of jobs
- Poverty

Top themes for identified opportunities

- Increase advocacy
- Increase partnership/coordination
- Increase education
- Increase jobs/employment opportunities

SECTION III: Health Equity

In this section, respondents were asked to explain if any of the forces ranked will positively or negatively impact equal opportunity for health and access to care based on race, ethnicity, gender, age, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, and/or education level. Forty-four open-ended responses were recorded for this question. Two common themes were mentioned:

- Disparities have decreased access to health services
- Additional barriers exist for those with health inequities

Forces of Change Assessment, Conclusion

Throughout all three sections of the FOCA survey, the FOCA Subcommittee elicited community participation in identifying the forces of change impacting the Will County public health system. As a result, the Subcommittee was able to utilize broad community input and refine the data into ten cross-cutting themes (listed below). These themes will be used to guide future strategic planning in the MAPP process and throughout Will County initiatives.

Final Forces of Change

- Access to transportation
- Access/affordability of healthy foods
- Access/affordability of housing
- Air and water quality
- Behavioral health/substance abuse
- Equitable and quality health care
- Funding for social service agencies
- Political climate
- Unemployment/underemployment
- Use and influence of technology/social media
