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Most people think they would know if they had an STD...wrong!

The truth is, a person can have a sexually transmitted disease (STD) but have no signs or symptoms. Or they may have mild signs that can be easily overlooked. If left untreated, STDs can cause long-term health issues, like infertility. If you are worried you've been exposed to an STD, talk to your doctor about being tested. STD testing isn't included in a regular sexual health exam, so wou will have to ask your doctor to be tested.

A pap exam does not test for STDs. You can bring up STD testing to your doctor by asking:

if I need to be tested?

I've never been tested for STDs, do I need to be?
What STDs are most common? How will I know

Depending on what you are being tested for, your doctor may need to perform a physical exam and take a blood, urine, or swab sample for testing... Easy!



5 questions your doctor will ask you about your sexual health
